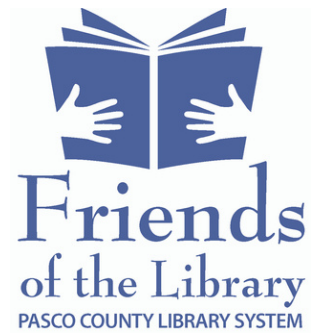

The Land O'Lakes Library Branch remodel is getting close to completion. In the meantime, we have been offering our sewing classes at other branches. Some of the projects we have offered at Centennial Park & Starkey Ranch TLC Branches include a basic sewing class which introduces new sewers to threading and using a machine. Our beginning sewers then moved on to making pillows, cloth napkins, cloth envelopes, cards, and book marks. Most recently they created pincushions and needle books so each beginning sewer can start their own collection of materials for hand and machine sewing.
